## **Fluorescent Light Bulbs**

#### Hazards

- Fluorescent light bulbs/lamps, including energy saving compact fluorescents, contain mercury. When a bulb/lamp breaks, it releases mercury which is toxic to the human nervous system and can poison wildlife into the air. Fishing in many Massachusetts water bodies is restricted due to mercury contamination.
- When a light bulb breaks, projected shards of glass may injure eyes or skin.

#### Handling

- Store bulbs/lamps in box or case to prevent breakage. Keep out of reach of children or pets.
- Wear glasses when handling bulbs/lamps.
- If you break a bulb; follow the MassDEP <u>Guidance for Cleaning Up Broken Compact</u> Fluorescent Light Bulbs (CFLs).

### **Management Options**

- Do not dispose of in the trash, especially if your community's solid waste goes to a combustion facility.

- Take to a municipal recycling center, if fluorescent bulbs/lamps are accepted.
- Take to a Household Hazardous Products Collection Center that accepts fluorescent bulbs/lamps for recycling.
